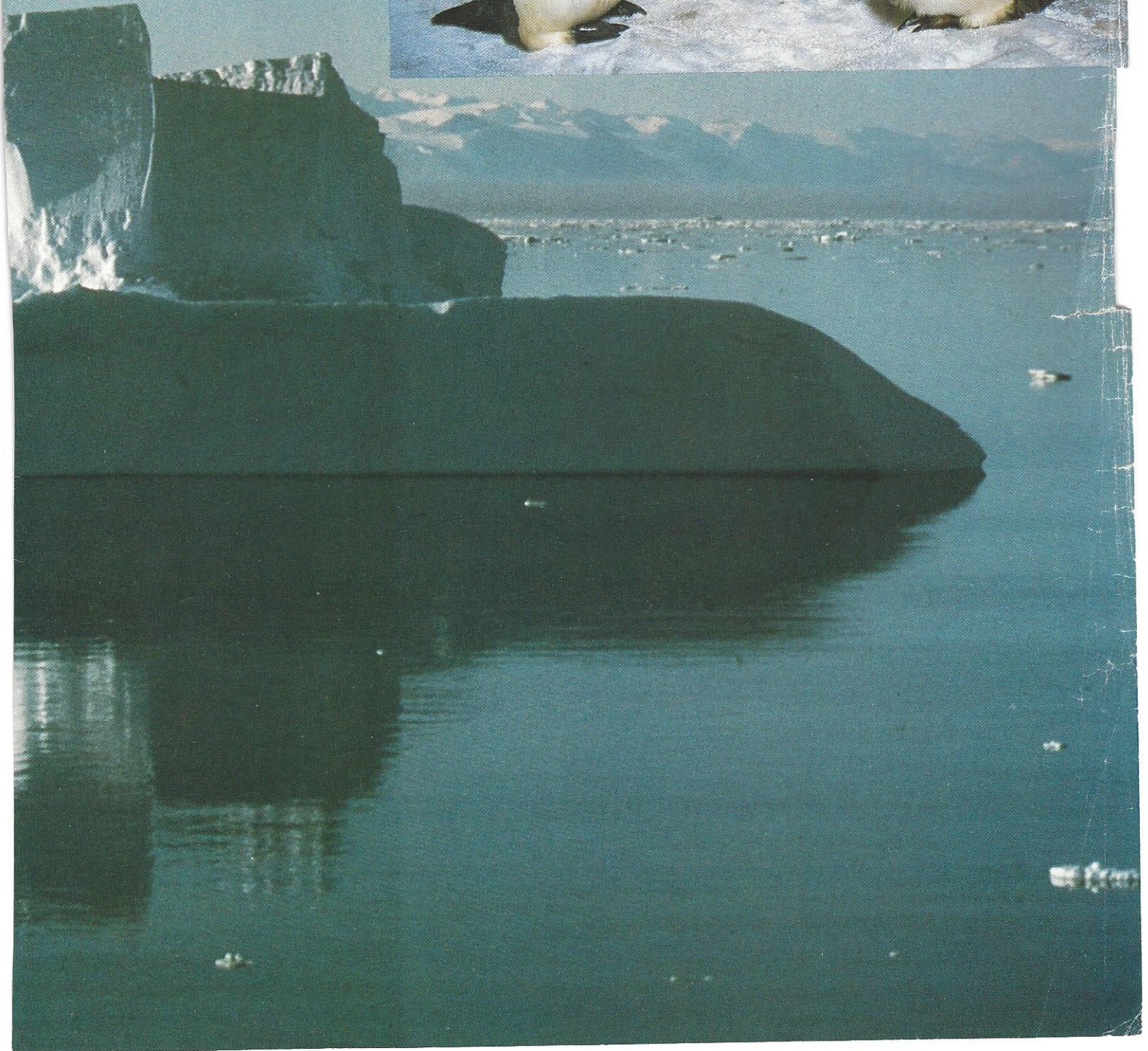


Museum maintains a wide selection of literature, including maps, original manuscripts, field manuals and scores of journals published around the world on Antarctic-related subjects.

David Harrowfield, the curator of the museum, points out that the busy season for the library and study rooms occurs in October and November, when the south-bound movement to the Antarctic summer peaks. In February and March, when polar people usually head homeward, the library often benefits from new materials presented by the returning travelers.
